As you are aware WHCVS grant from the Borough Council has been severely cut. In fact we have been hit the most from the selection of charities that the Borough funds.

What this means for CVS is that services will be either, greatly reduced or projects (in particular) the Volunteer Bureau will be axed. This is very sad indeed because clubs like yours have benefited greatly from our services.

We have been told that the Bill Salmon Centre will close on 31 March. All 8 charities have been offered alternative (not ideal) accommodation. CVS will remain in Hatfield Town Centre sharing an office with Hertsavers Credit Union. Again added expenses to our already drained resources.
